NOTES

- (1) Where either party is under age and is not a widower or widow, consent in writing in accordance with sections 19-22 of the Act must be annexed to this application.
- (2) Insert “bachelor”, “widower” or “divorced person” and “spinster”, “widow” or “divorced person”, as the case may be. In the case of a widower or widow, a certificate of death of the former spouse should be produced; in the case of a divorced person, an office copy of the decree absolute.
- (3) Clauses 5 and 6 of the application deal respectively with the reasons why notice has not been given to the Registrar and why it is now desired to proceed without notice. It must be appreciated that the grant of a Special Licence is *entirely discretionary*, and, since it is an exemption from statutory requirements, will not be made unless reasonable grounds are shown.
